The new application still does not satisfy my objections to the previous one. I object to this application on the following grounds:

- 1/ The garden of my house is already tiny and hemmed in by a commercial garage. The blank wall on the side of the proposed extension would loom over and dominate my garden
- 2/ The proposed extension would further restrict the light into my garden
- 3/ There would be a loss of green space, already in short supply in this environment
- 4/ there would be a dead space between the boundary wall and the proposed extension, quite likely a source of weeds and unpleasant growth
- 5/ Extra weight on the ground might cause subsidence
- 6/ This is a conservation area and this part has already been fairly extensively developed, with rear extensions on my property and on No 9, plus a garage which has cut off my garden and to a lesser extent the garden of No 9. It's about time development in this area was terminated.

Your comments

1 object to the planning application on the following grounds;

1/ The proposed building will deprive my living room of much light, it is already gloomy because of surrounding walls and buildings, a further extension of Number 9 Patshull Road would decrease daylight to my living area even more. I am suffering from a disabling illness with no sign of cure, consequently I cannot go out much, and the little bit of daylight I see gives me great pleasure, I believe I would be deprived of this.

Also the shared garden at the rear of the property where I live would be deprived of more light for the garden making it colder and even harder to grow plants. This also gives me great pleasure, as does the garden at No 9, which would disappear leaving me with another brick wall to look at.

2/ As I am sure you are aware, the paving or building over of gardens in urban situations can cause the problem of increased run-off, due to rainfall not being soaked into the soil. Consequently I believe this can cause the problem of local flooding, the last thing I need is flooding at my backdoor. The more such proposals are accepted the more difficult it is to oppose, so there is also the problem of similar extensions further up Patshull Road possibly causing problems such as flooding, subsidence and damp.

3/ Also, the building over of "green" land, i.e. gardens causes the blocking of "green corridors" which wildlife of all kinds relies on to move around in the urban environment. It is easy to think this is only one exclusion and won't cause much harm, but as it is added on, once one application is approved it opens the door to others, in the long term having a severe, and detrimental effect on urban wildlife which is so important to us all and ultimately the health of the city and therefore the planet. I belong to several wildlife organisations and I know how the lack of sensitivity to this problem causes the decline in numbers of some wildlife often drastically, and upsets the precious balance which helps prevent the domination by more numerous species.
