This is evident in the remaining mouldings, and has escaped the unsightly erosion and 'notching' that other houses have suffered when owners wish to expose the mansard sashes fully for no real purpose. If none of the other parapets were cut in this way, would number 46 be allowed to do this? If the answer is no because it is unsightly, why then allow it now? Previous erosion of the important parapet line was a mistake - as evidenced in the ragged, broken elevational line in the terrace drawing. This last unaltered, unreconstructed parapet needs to remain to hold the end of this terrace together as some form of unified expression of the original building line. Perhaps rather than further eroding the parapet line, the cornice could be reinstated?</p>
