	The white plastic(maintenance free)privacy fence is a Landlord responsi provided to shield the 4 adjacent terraces —which are one storey below from it's residents view, and contractors visiting the North Block's Utility Services, i.e. lift engineers servicing 4 times a year & breakdor servicing/repairing the bathroom air extraction system, servicing the central drainage system/clearing blockages, repairs to the lighting & the central water supply, and over the last 2 years frequent visits fom surveyors, roofers, building contractor to eliminate terrace 29 leaks. When the fence blew down in the storm of 1987, the presence of workmen being overly curious was a real nuisance.	29 /ns

## Public Notice

Another matter of concern is that there is no Planning Notice publicly displayed in the area. I have been told by a fellow resident that one Application Notice was fixed to the Parking Notice pole outside 119, but by the 10th june when I had returned from holiday, it had been removed, and now there is nothing on Haverstock Hill making it known. This means that nearby owners/residents, particularly those opposite who will be affected, are not aware of these proposals and being given the opportunity (to which they are entitled) to comment on their changed view.

## My OBJECTIONS

APPEARANCE—The design and appearance of 119 is attractive and pleasing, mainly due to the clean sleek lines of the slim strip like windows, which are compimented and reflected by the balanced lines of the different roof levels, giving an almost Art Deco look to building. The addition proposed for the N Block brick frontage of half glass (some times) and halfgreen wood posts with stringers covered with artificial ivy, is entirely out of keeping with the rest of the building line, it looks very odd, is out of place and balance, plus being aesthetically displeasing to look at Moreover, where is the privacy principle with glass that is ther sometimes and not others. Where is the biodiversity with all the artificial 'planting'.

SAFETY-A serious concern that terrace 29 experiences very high gusty winds blowing across-as high as 90 mph.and the glass panes lookif they will catch these - like a sail in the wind-as they appear to be fixed to concrete batten laid on the roof floor, which to my mind makes them quite vulnerable to gale force winds. During the 1987 storm two fences wereblown down, one was between my terrace and 29, and the other at the other end of the building - which the then Lessee had changed to unauthorised glass panels—which shattered on the ground below-at the side of the building. Whereas the proposed panels overlook the front driveway and street. Such glass panels—particularly fancy up and down ones—would need to have very strong Guarantees as to their safety.
