I especially object to the Newlands Plot proposals which will destroy mature trees and an important open space. This is far too close (as is Carmel) to the proposed construction work, noise and nuisance from H52 works or therefore will be unsuitable to rehouse people here. The proposed commercial space at the base of the building will cause noise and a potential crime spot from people/gangs 'hanging around' as they do round the shops on Robert Street. The proposed path and access at the back of Carmel a part Newlands impacts on the privacy and security of those blocks as previously, no public access of thoroughfare existed. The new building will also cut out days sunlight to flats in Carmel & Newlands. Resident wildlife will be affected Carmel & Newlands already sited at the sharp end of H52 construction will be further subjected to construction work over before H52 begins. Many of these objections also apply to the former one stop shop site. Site's proposed further away from the H52 line of construction are fine as they do



stupidity


