Dear Sirs,

I write this letter quickly, to explain the letter that was sent on my behalf (Me Lucy Ryder) by a very well meaning foreigner with a very poor command of English. The result is gibbers. Please disregards it, I will now try to write that again.

My name is Lucy Ryder I live at 21c Lindfield Garden NW3 6PX, I refer to the proposed development at 4 Langland garden to extend and develop the basement of their property and increase its size. The garden abbots, my garden at 21 c Lindfield Garden (of which I am the freeholder) and runs along the whole width of my garden with very negative effect on my plants and trees in my garden.
