Dear Mr. Arnone,

This is poor advice by Michael Chester & Partners. I should like to object to the proposal to fell an important mature lime tree in a heavily polluted area with relatively few trees. Lime is the most effective species for trapping vehicle particulates and felling this native tree will have a negative impact on both air quality and biodiversity.

I would suggest that, instead, the applicant should adopt best practice and incorporate the tree trunk into a new wall. There are already various examples of how this can be achieved in the Redington Frogna Conservation Area (eg Redington Road, Platts Lane). The need to rebuild a brick wall is no excuse to fell a mature tree.
