I am writing to object strongly to the above developments:

1. Any further loss of office accommodation in this area is undesirable and detrimental to the character and economy of the area.
2. As an ex-industrial building, there has almost certainly been environmental pollution on the site which makes it unsafe for residential use.
3. I have major reservations about the traffic implications of the development. Any increase in residential parking in what is already an overcrowded street is highly undesirable. I also believe that any increase in traffic would represent a threat to the safety of the many children who use Gloucester Avenue on their way to and from school.
