The submitted plans in relation to the level plans (condition 13) and the demarcation boundary are considered to be acceptable. The Level plans demonstrate that the development's proposed threshold/interfaces with the public highway will match existing highway levels. The revised submitted boundary demarcation plan submitted in support of condition 14 is also considered to be acceptable.

As such, the proposed details are in general accordance with policies CS5, CS11 and CS14 and policies DP16, DP21 and DP24.
