Proposal: Erection of a single storey roof extension and terrace Drawing Nos:

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed roof extension would create an incongruous roof top addition to a building that has already been extended at roof level, and by reason of its size, location and detailed design, would be harmful to the character and appearance of the host building, group of buildings it forms a part of, and the West End Green conservation area. The extension is therefore contrary to policies CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.



2 The proposed single storey roof extension would have an unacceptable impact on the neighbouring amenity in terms of loss of light to the adjacent lightwell windows, contrary to policy CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
