Full Planning Permission Refused

Proposal: Change of use of basement of Nos. 307-309 and ground floor of No. 309 from Strip Club (Sui Generis) to Night Club (Sui Generis)

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed development, by reason of the nature of its use, capacity and proximity to residential properties, would be an unacceptable intensification of the late night use of the site which would lead to crime and community safety concerns and would unduly harm the amenity of adjoining and nearby residential occupiers contrary to policies CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development), CS7 (Promoting Camden's centres and shops) and CS17 (Making Camden a safer



place) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP12 (Supporting strong centres and managing the impact of food, drink, entertainment and other town centre uses), DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) and DP28 (Noise and vibration) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
