1 Reasons for granting permission:

The details submitted for condition 23 includes a report that presents the results of



a ground movement assessment for the proposed redevelopment and refurbishment of the former sorting office and an assessment of its potential impact on the nearby London Underground Lines assets. The report concludes that the proposed works would not negatively impact the LUL tunnels.

London Underground (LU) have confirmed that the applicant is working with LU engineers with regards to the development and had no comments to make on the submitted report subject to continued co-operation. LU have no objection to the condition being discharged on this basis.

The proposals are in accordance with policy CS5 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy 6.3 of the London Plan 2015, consolidated with alterations since 2011.
