					22 Frognal Way has been a derelict site for many years and is an eyesore in an otherwise attractive and rural road. From an architectural standpoint, the original house has limited merit and does not provide an important example of a house of that era. The planned development provides an opportunity to replace the dilapidated house with a property which will blend well into the surrounding area and enhance the conservation area.		
					I have seen the new plans and had a chance to discuss them with the architects and the San family at the open days, and my hope is that a single modern house of low quality that makes a negative contribution to the conservation area will be replaced by a single modern house of high quality that will be a positive contribution to the road and the conservation area. The replacement house is low built and no taller than the house it replaces, and is substantially lower than its neighbours. It can barely be seen from the street and the wider area.		
					The plans depict a house blending into the landscape and is covered by a planted garden roof such that the views from Church Row will show it blending well, into the landscape and the views from the public domain and Church Row will be a huge improvement over the unattractive flat roof and unflattering building that they see today.
