sent on behalf of a gentleman council tenant in Bradwell House who wishes to remain anonymous- he does not have a computer and has asked this to be put forward on his behalf.

1. I do not want cladding of the estate because it will make the balconies narrower. It may comply with building regulations, but the human factor is not being considered - for example a mother with a single pram might just be able to get by but on our balcony we have a mother with a double buggy, and it would be almost impossible for her to bring this along.

2. also we know of wheelchair users who are very very upset about the narrowing of the balcony.

3. it hasn't been taken into account, that the coal storage attached to each flat, sticks out beyond the wall about 8", so have, even reduced thickness cladding added to this, will make the balcony even narrower.

4. the coal storage unit attached to each flat will not be useable after the cladding, and it is essential for us to use this for storage as our flat is very small.
