I feel intimidated walking on the pavement past these men, they stare, they spit, I mean full phlegm. It is hard to walk on Cheriton side of the road as it is always full, and they don't move freely. Parking, well. I have never seen so many disabled badges in my life... There are so many cars, it's unreal. So having anyone visit at times of prayer is impossible. This is very hard for me, as I do have people visit, people who help with my children. My children's grandmother is registered disabled and is accompanied by someone all the time, however, it is not always easy for her to visit as there is no space. I know the point of, visit at a different time could be raised, but why should my guests have to visit my children at a time dictated to them.
