A friend of mine has sent me the attachment below which contains an article in a local newspaper in Kilburn about the proposal to "clad" the buildings on her estate.

The article mentions that the estate was designed by an eminent post-war architect and quotes Ed Fordham of Historic Kilburn who says "This is one of the most historically and architecturally important estates in London".

I feel strongly that the UK should be conserving its architectural heritage, whatever that heritage is - from Georgian and Victorian terraces, to 1930's semi-detached homes to social housing.
