Thanks for the letter re the above.

I have a few questions;

- 1) Will all the black iron work balconies etc be scrapped back and repainted as part of the work as they are in poor condition.
- 2) Secondly and more importantly are you looking at replacing the 20+ year old double glazed windows that serve very little purpose in keeping out wind in bad weather and let the cold in, they are no longer fit for purpose and are in my opinion more important and necessary than the proposed cladding.
- 3) Also the internal communal areas are in need of a paint job and renewal of tiles.
