Whilst, in the long term, change of use might be a possibility to be considered, there has been no consultation or understanding sought by the applicant from the large local resident population. Particularly;

- Over development of the site, that already comprises the YMCA, Casino, 3 restaurant/bars, hairdressers, sandwich bar and 2 shops. Adding a further 166 rooms, totaling 886 rooms. The site originally had permission for 240 rooms. Is there the infrastructure to take this level of development
- Air Intake and Extract Plant Machinery to service the rooms underground is placed at ground level facing the Adeline Place frontages of Bedford Court Mansions, residential buildings of 132 homes
- 24 hours a day, 365 days a year aircon/extraction noise and fumes
