The council have objected to the Fascia design, pin hole shutter, and sliding door of the shop. Fascia:- The existing building was used as a pub prior to its conversion into a convenience store. The appellant runs the store through a franchise called Nisa. Part of Nisa company plan is to provide the same style of facia to all its stores. Therefore, the fascia band has been installed to similar size as all the stores nationally and it is a corporate design for the company. The band is a modern design which is suitable in appearance in the conservation area. Pin Hole Shutter The shutter is essential for the security of the store. The shutter is only used at night as the store is open from 7am to 11pm. Therefore, the shutter has less of an impact on the conservation area. Sliding Door								
The sliding door is a modern design and does not cause any harm to the local character and appearance of the conservation area. The materials used are longer lasting and maintenance free. The previous timber doors were not suitable for the store. Therefore, we request that planning permission should be granted for the above.
