We suggest that the following native species should be included in any hedgerow mix: native British yew, hawthorn, wild privet and hazel. A pond would also be beneficial in helping to encourage the return of the (now displaced) bats, in line with the emerging Neighbourhood Plan for the Redington Frognal area.
					Similarly, new trees to be planted should include insect-friendly species, such as oak, silver birch and alder.
