Following revised drawing and information, the window details are considered to be a sympathetic design consistent with the host building and surrounding Conservation Area. The details are therefore sufficient to discharge condition 4 of planning permission 2015/2657/P.



Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving the building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possesses, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013. The CAAC has withdrawn their objection and application is being determined under delegated powers.

As such, the proposed submission is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24, DP25, and DP26 London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
