The proposed crossover and driveway are in a dangerous position and should be inspected by Highways before any recommendation is made. Traffic (including goods traffic and emergency vehicles) pick up speed downhill and cannot see this location which is round a slight bend. The proposed driveway position is currently double yellow lines and about 27m downhill from the junction. Backing out of the driveway would be a hazardous blind manoeuvre with almost no view of oncoming downhill traffic
