The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reasons:

Reasons for Refusal

The proposed extension by reason of its size and siting would appear as an unduly prominent and incongruous addition resulting in harm to the character of the host building, the symmetry of the semidetached pair of shop fronts and the character and appearance of the West End Green conservation area contrary to polices CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development) and CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, polices DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's Heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies and policies 2



- (Design & Character) and 3 (Safeguarding and enhancing Conservation Areas and heritage sites) of the Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan.
- The proposed extension by reason of its size and siting would reduce the width and function of the footpath harming ease of pedestrian movement and pedestrian amenity and safety contrary to policies CS11 (Promoting sustainable and efficient travel) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, policies DP16 (Promoting sustainable and efficient transport), DP17 (walking, cycling and public transport) and DP21 (Development connecting to the highway network) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies and policy 9 (Pavements & Pedestrians) of the Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
