I am writing to add my voice to those objecting to the proposed development plans at 11 Rosslyn Hill, NW3.

My objections are based on the serious negative impact the proposed works will have on the survival of the neighbouring Air Studios.

I note that consideration has been given to the welfare of trees on the site, but I was unable to find any reference to the deleterious impact these proposals will have on the livelihood of the many individuals who work at the studios.

As you know by now, Air Studios is not an insignificant enterprise. The British (and International) film industry uses soundtracks recorded there by first class studio and orchestral musicians for major movies. Leading performers in the music industry rely on Air Studios' facilities to make their successful recordings.
