The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

The proposed bird and bat nesting boxes / bricks details and specifications submitted are considered to be satisfactory in demonstrating the proposed development contributes towards creation of habitats and valuable areas for



biodiversity would be achieved. It is considered that there is a variety of orientations proposed to encourage increase uptake for bats and birds.

The details submitted within the BMD are therefore sufficient to discharge condition 14 of planning permission 2014/3327/P.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS15 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP22 and DP24 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies. The proposed development also accords with policies 5.3 and 7.19 of the London Plan March 2015 consolidated with alterations since 2011; and paragraphs 14, 17, 56 -66 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
