					As our surveyor has stated there is evidence of movement and deflection to the main structures of the building. This is visible from the road on the front of the building both on the right for 16/18 Belsize Lane and on the left 20/22 Belsize Lane. There is also evidence of marked movement inside the building.	
					The recent work at 22 Belsize Lane over the last two years, including a rear extension, caused further movement and new cracks internally in 16-18 Belsize Lane.
