If listed building consent is required for the electronic communications development carried out, it should be granted. The development carried out accords with the provisions of the development plan and other material considerations including the NPPF. In particular, any harm to the heritage asset is trivial and the public benefits of granting consent substantially outweigh that harm.

The electronic communications apparatus has been installed at the property since 2001 without any complaint from the LPA. It was only when planning and listed building consent applications were made to the LPA to upgrade the apparatus in 2014 that the LPA sought to question the installation. Having regard to the demonstrable need in the public interest for the development carried out, its trivial impact on the listed building, the time the development has been in place without complaint and the LPA's negative approach to electronic communications development, it is considered that a minimum of 12 months will be required to make alternative provision.
(i) That the steps required by the notice for the purpose of restoring the character of the building to its former state would not serve that purpose. \Box
