35 Great Queen Street forms a terrace of 3 houses, c1710. Exterior is brown brick with red brick cornices below parapet. Moulded brick band at 2nd floor. Red brick dressing arches to flush frame windows. Shopfront is late 20th Century.

Present signage doesn't fit with the proportions, or the material, of the building.

Building would benefit from the removal of the existing Powder coated box with oversized pin mounted letters and reduction of projecting lights from 5 down to 3.

Black painted timber fascia panel with smaller gold pin mounted letter would be more suitable.

This would enhance the heritage significance of the whole conservation area for the following reasons:

Most of the recently developed shopfront signs on this side of the street have been in black colour with contrasting letters.
