LISTED BUILDING ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

OF Ground Floor Flat 50 Maple Street London W1T 6HJ

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE**, which is issued by the Council being the Local Planning Authority for the purposes of Section 38 of the above Act because it appears to them that there has been a contravention of Section 8 of the Act, in respect of the building within a conservation area described below. The Council considers it necessary to issue this notice for the reasons set out in paragraph 4 below.

2. THE LISTED BUILDING.

Land at: Ground Floor Flat 50 Maple Street London W1T 6HJ as shown, for the purposes of identification only, outlined in black on the attached plan.

3. THE CONTRAVENTION ALLEGED.

Without listed building consent:

- 1. The removal of a small timber door from the vaults accessed from the front basement area and its replacement with a white uPVC window.
- 2. The removal of a timber front door and door frame from the front basement area and its replacement with white uPVC front door and door frame.
- 3. The painting of the front elevation yellow.
- 4. The removal of a timber sliding sash window from the rear elevation at ground floor level and its replacement with white uPVC French doors.
- 5. The installation of a wooden veranda at rear ground floor level with timber steps descending from the veranda into the rear basement yard.
- 6. The creation of a single storey timber addition at rear basement level.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

a) The work outlined above has been carried out to this Grade II listed building without the benefit of Listed Building Consent.

b) The installation of white uPVC doors and windows, the painting of the exterior yellow, the creation of timber steps, veranda and single storey rear extension all detract from the special architectural and historic character of the listed building contrary to policies CS14 (promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) and DP25 (conserving our heritage) of the Local Development Framework Development Policies.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Within a period of three months of the Notice taking effect:

- The white uPVC window into the vaults at front basement area be removed and replaced with a timber door to match that which was removed.
- 2. The white uPVC door and door frame in the front basement area shall be removed and replaced with a timber door to match that which was removed.
- The white uPVC French doors and door frames at rear ground floor level shall be replaced with a timber sliding sash window of six over six panes to match that which was removed.
- 4. The wooden veranda and steps at rear ground floor and basement level shall be permanently removed from site and the rear elevation made good.
- 5. The single storey extension at rear basement level shall be permanently removed from site and the rear elevation made good.

6. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on **31 July 2015**, unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.
