The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).



All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP24 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission.

The principle of a mansard extension has been established as acceptable under a recent planning application at the site (2015/0506/P). The proposal would be amended from the approved scheme to bring the roof extension slightly further forward towards the front parapet and would introduce more glazing on the front elevation.

The revisions are considered to be acceptable, the mansard would remain set back from the front building line and given the height of the parapet it would not be overly visible from the street. Due to its size and location, it would not significantly harm the amenity of any adjoining residential occupiers in terms of loss of light, outlook, enclosure or privacy.

The application site is not within a conservation area and is not a listed building, the original valley roof and rear butterfly parapet has been removed and replaced with a sloped roof. The proposal would see a rear butterfly parapet reintroduced which is welcomed and encouraged in CPG1:Design.

Whilst the development will have some impact in terms of raising the height of the host building, such an extension in this location is not considered harmful to the character or appearance of the host building or the streetscene given that there are similar examples in the wider area and that it would be set back from the front elevation.

One objection has been received and duly taken into account prior to making this decision. The site's planning history and relevant appeal decisions were taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies. The proposed development also accords with policies 7.4 and 7.6 of the London Plan 2015; and paragraphs 14, 17 and 66 of the National Planning Policy

- Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts which cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. - Your proposals may be subject to control under the Party Wall etc Act 1996 which covers party wall matters, boundary walls and excavations near neighbouring buildings. You are advised to consult a suitably qualified and experienced Building Engineer.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
