STRONG OBJECTION TO THE PROPOSED FELLING OF THE HOLLY
TREE IN THE GARDEN OF NO 14 HIGHGATE WEST HILL

- 1) It is visible from the Heath, and provides a natural screening of the buildings at NO 14 and 13, ensuring the 'vision of green' remains to all heath lovers, essential to the ethos of the conservation area.
- 2) It is visible from the gardens and windows of neighbouring properties in Highgate West Hill, Millfield Lane and the Holly Lodge Estate and would be sorely missed by these residents. Some have not received the notification of the proposed felling as they are renting, such as those in Cameo Lodge and they have signed the petition. There are other residents in 12, 10 Millfield Lane who were also not consulted and who can see the tree from their windows. They have also signed the petition enclosed.
- 3) It is the home to many insects which can be clearly seen at dusk, providing succor to birds and bats (the area is heavily populated with bats and is abundant with bird life). We have also recently found a nest in the tree, which supports this.
- 4) It is a healthy, beautiful specimen, and the home of birds and bees in the summer. One of the rangers on the Heath have said that it is one of the finest specimens of berried Holly Trees he has ever seen.
- 5) It is a twin to another, identical Holly in the garden of No 13 Highgate West Hill, which provides a pleasant historical setting to these two Grade II listed properties.
- 6) It provides essential screening to the properties no 13 Highgate West Hill and Cameo Lodge. The council has given the residents of no 13 Highgate West Hill permission to raise a metal privacy screen and grow a evergreen creeper over it, as the developer of no 14 built a terrace and did not inform the residents of the no 13.
- 7) The residents of no 13 have very real concerns as to the sustainability of this creeper, the safety of the trellis and the metal screen if this tree is felled.

The petition has been signed by many local residents and Heath Lovers as well as rangers on the Heath and local gardeners. We all feel that the beauty of this old and healthy tree should not be lost to us, let alone the wildlife it supports. There is a very strong objection to the needless felling of a lovely, old healthy tree which has many more years of joy to bring to local people.

We also have found a level of intimidation around
the immediate neighbours, which should be taken into
consideration.

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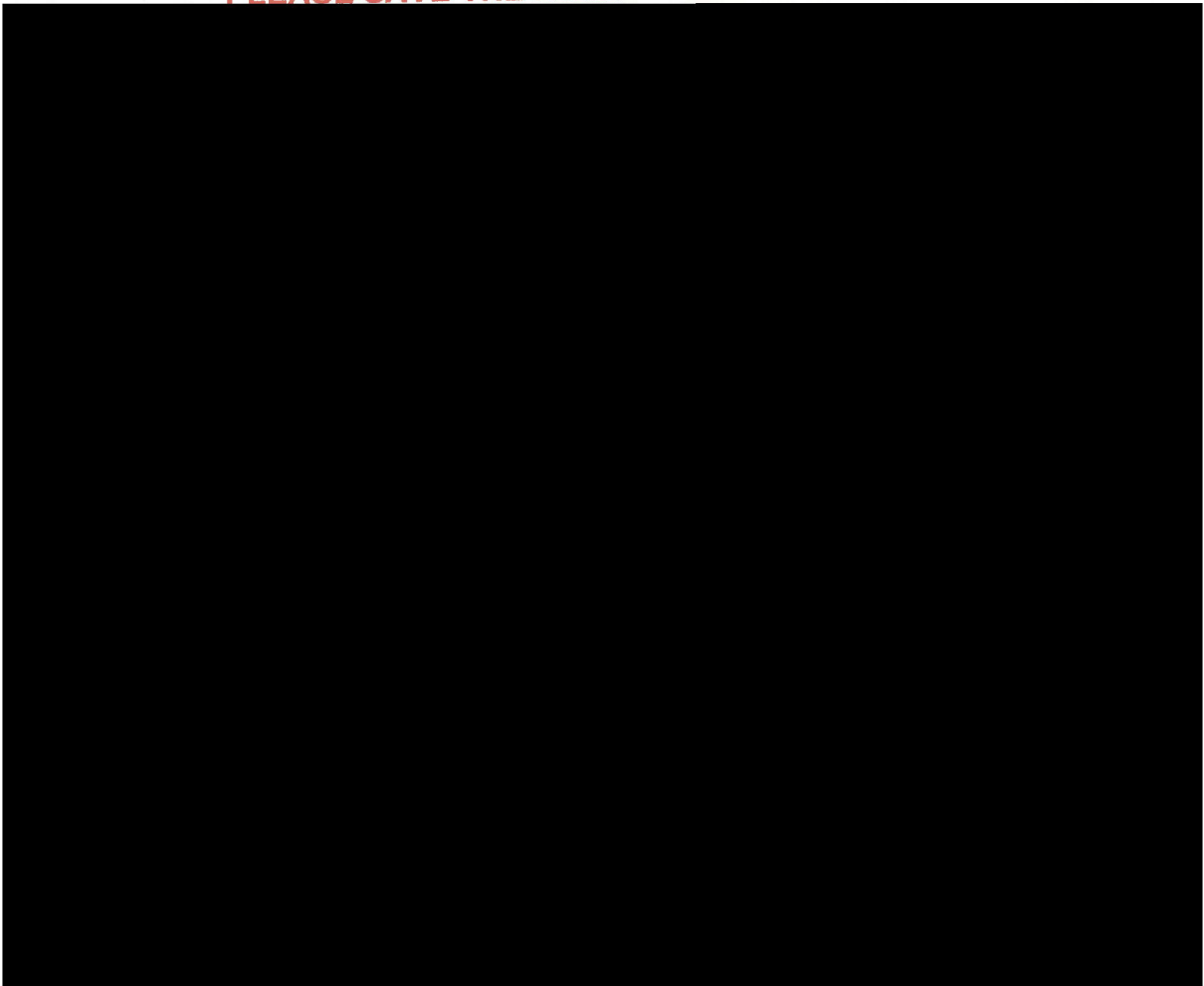
