

The Brief

As part of a general internal renovation of the free-hold property we seek an application to replace the existing window frames and glazing like-for-like, and to introduce a sliding door and rooflight to 7 St Paul's Mews NW1 9TZ.



Location

7 St Paul's Mews is situated within Inner London in the Borough of Camden, is St. Paul's Mews; a gated and cobbled Mews Style cul-de-sac off St. Paul's Crescent. The Mews contains 30 properties used for residential purposes. The Mews is part of the Camden Square Conservation Area; designated in October 1974, it includes Camden Square and Rochester Square, bordered by Camden Road in the North West. The area has a distinct pattern of wide streets lined with houses. Set back from the street with Mews behind. The Mews typically consist of two storey buildings standing at the back of narrow roadways. Built between 1987-91 and laid out in a double curve, the three storey properties have plain and rendered brickwork facades with a mixture of gable and parapet roof styles, surrounded by a cobbled road surface. The properties are linked together with panelled garages and entrances, with two storeys of brick above for accommodation.
