Of far greater concern is that 101, like many, use their back add. flat roof to sun lounge and so they look directly into my bedroom (and, had I not installed obscure glass) into my bathrooms. Camden Planners used (early '80s) to insist that if flat back add. roofs were used in this way, the owners must plant or erect screens so that they could not invade other people's privacy by looking directly into their bedrooms, bathrooms, etc. What has happened to this very sensible regulation? It would be most helpful if this could be revived/enforced.  Neighbours should not have to install obscure glass, which prevents them seeing out, in their living and bed rooms, in order to protect their privacy and prevent neighbours looking in.  As regards the proposed first floor balcony, certainly it enables overlooking of adjoining gardens but these can already be overlooked by just looking out of any rear window. I have therefore no objection to the balcony.  I understand that this application refers only to the balcony and does not in any way modify the pre-existing plans for which Camden has already given consent.
