Thank you for your letter dated 20 November 2015.

Transport for London (TfL) has reviewed the application. The application site is directly adjacent to Finchley Road London Underground (LU) station. Details of the application are limited and it is TfL's understanding that no structural changes, or additions, are required to the building. It is also TfL's understanding that the development is car free.

TfL requests that cycle parking is provided in accordance with London Plan (2015) standards for the entire floor area. Cycle changing facilities (such as showers) should be provided and secured by planning condition. TfL also requests that all access to the site during construction be from Canfield Place.

Further consultation with TfL would be required should any structural changes, or additions to the building, be proposed to the building. This is due to the interface of the building with the LU network.
