The density of the project is still too high. This affects the immediate neighbours, but also the wider area. Where will the children from 9 new families go to school?  2. There are still serious problems of overlooking for residents of Fortess Road, e.g. from the proposed 2nd floor balconies.  3. The architects still seem to be using the outdated map which doesn't show the extension to 44a Fortess Road.  4. The unglazed central courtyards will act as echo chambers creating significant noise pollution as generated by 9 families.  5. The skylights on the houses will create significant light pollution for the houses at 2-4 Railey Mews.  6. Contamination issues still haven't been properly addressed and seem to be being glossed over. This is dangerous and unacceptable.  7. Building a development with no affordable workspace and no affordable housing is at odds with Camden Council's stated aims for new devleopments.  8. It would appear that the architects are trying to employ a 'divide and conquer' strategy re the Residents Association. They have addressed some of the major concerns of Railey Mews residents, but none of the concerns of the Fortess Grove and Fortess Road residents. They also suggested holding a meeting with a "select" group of tenants. Our Residents Association will not be divided in this way. We are concerned about the impact of this development on all of our neighbours as well as on the wider community. We have been very disappointed that the architects have attempted this strategy.
