Replacement of existing public telephone kiosk with combine public telephone and Automated Teller Machine (ATM) kiosk.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed kiosk, by reason of its location, size and detailed design, would result in visual clutter to the detriment of the visual amenity of the streetscene contrary to Core Strategy Policies CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development) and CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP24 (Securing high quality design) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.



The proposed kiosk, by virtue of its inappropriate siting and design and lack of security safeguarding measures, would fail to reduce opportunities for crime and antisocial behaviour to the detriment of community safety and security, contrary to policy CS17 (Making Camden a safer place) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
