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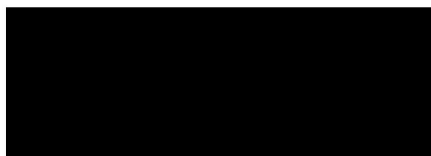
Having considered the submitted document I recommend its approval. No further archaeological work is necessary and the archaeological condition under this application has been satisfied.
