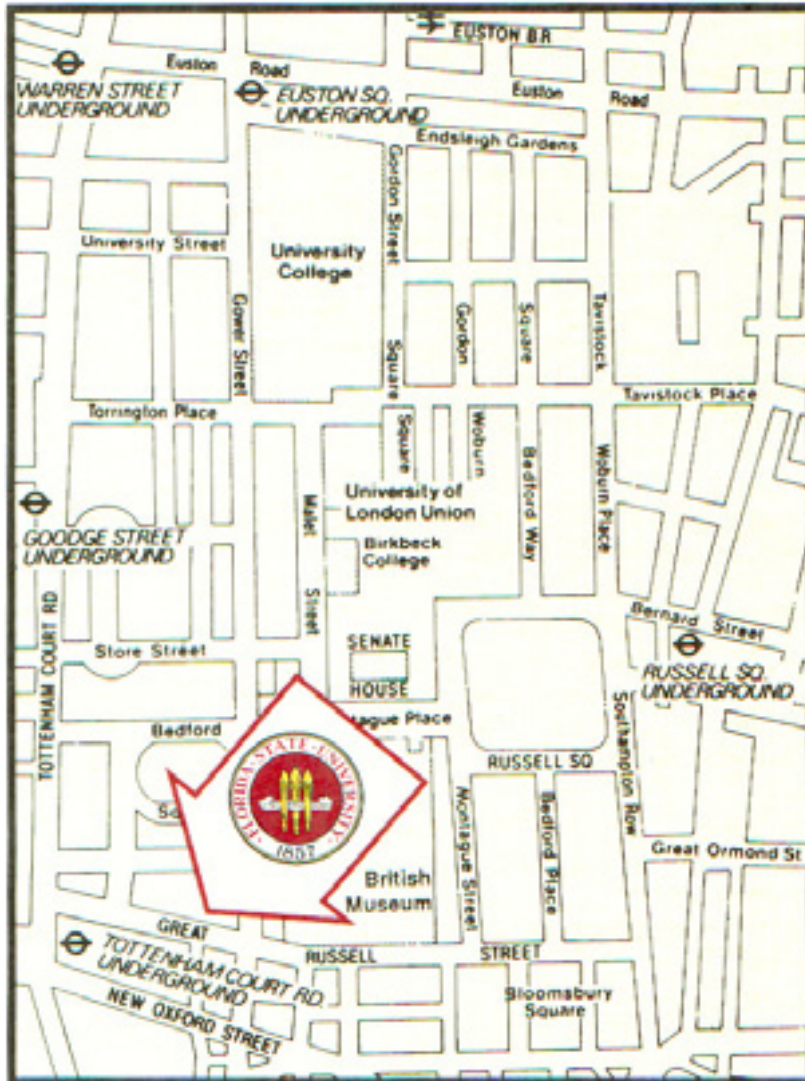

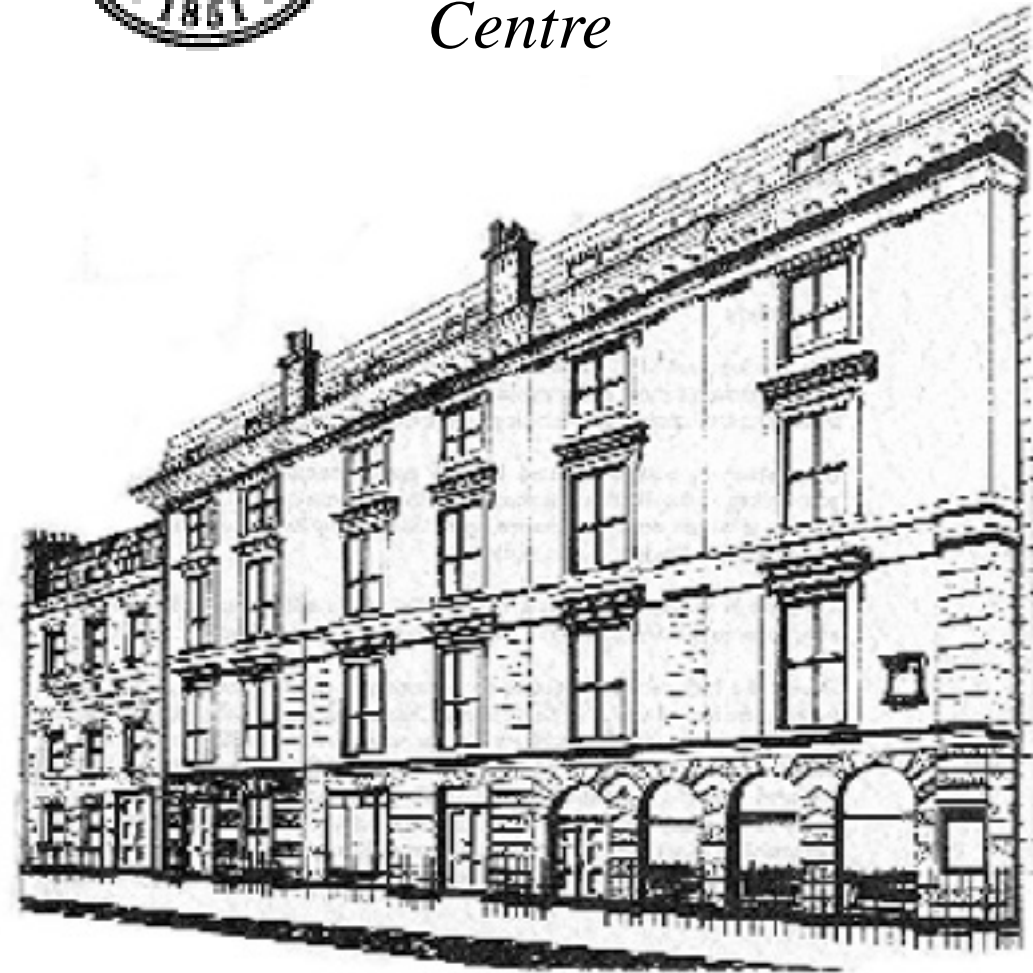

Although a large part of the building dates back to the 17th century, the property has been completely refurbished to include all modern amenities and facilities for education and housing.

The centre is conveniently located in the heart of Bloomsbury—400 yards from the British Museum and Tottenham Court Road underground station, within walking distance of London's famous theatre district, Covent Garden, Soho and the best shopping in the capital, with London's teaching hospitals in the vicinity. There are also many hotels nearby to cater to all tastes and budgets.

Bloomsbury

The development of Bloomsbury began in the early 1660's and soon became one of London's most fashionable districts and a place of residence for rich merchants and aristocrats with elegant squares characterising the area.

Bloomsbury is now dominated by two great institutions of learning and scholarship—the British Museum and the University of London, whose campus is within walking distance, and students may have the opportunity to intermix in the Student Union Building.

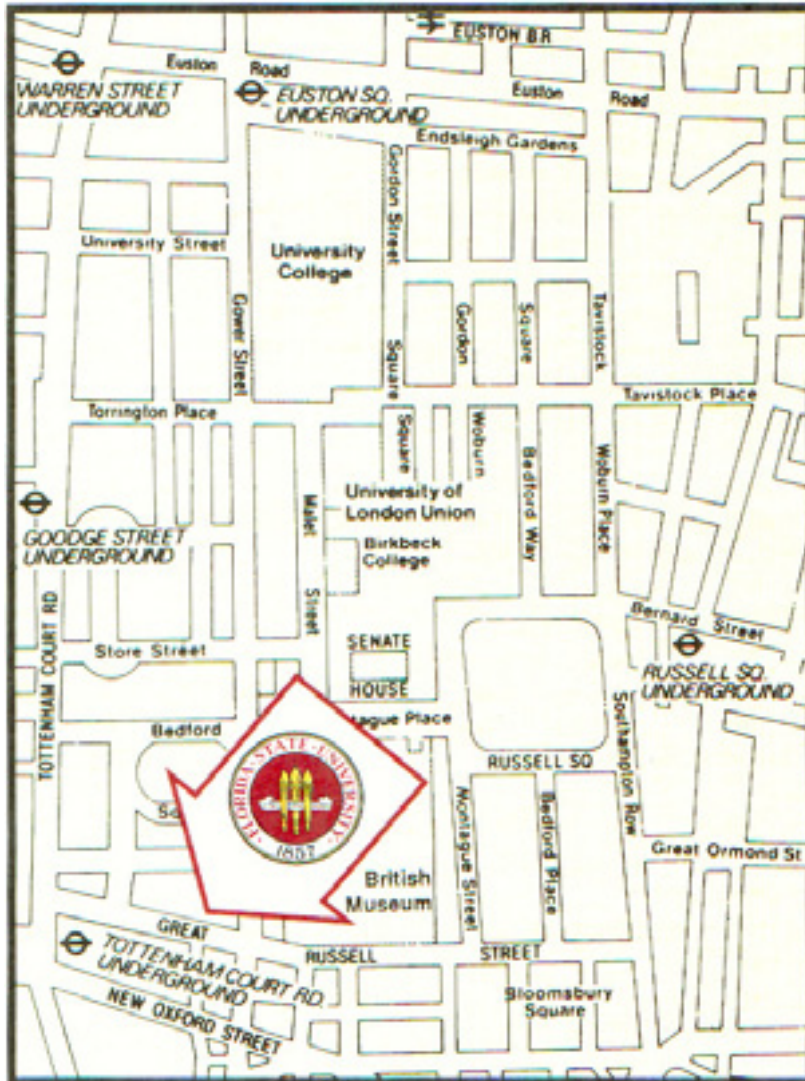

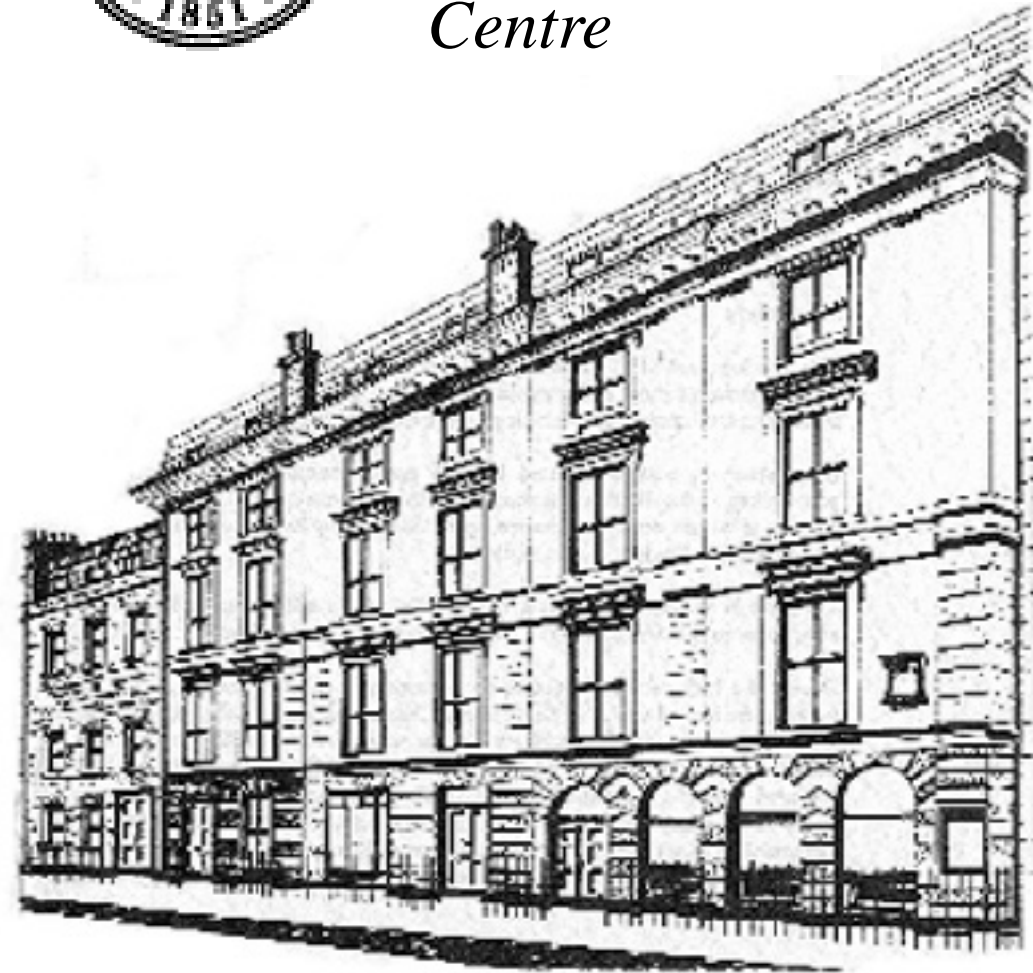
