The existing garages are an incredible eyesore, blighting the otherwise nice outlook from all houses flanking the East side of Belsize Crescent. 2. The attempt to remodel them is welcome, though it would be bar far best if the garages are removed altogether. 3. If the garages are to remain, but in another form, replacing them with virtually identical structures represents a missed opportunity for improving the area. 4. The flat roof topping the garages is the most exposed and visible part of the existing structures. Fitting a similar flat roof, but with 'green' covering is unlikely to improve the current situation in the long term - the 'green roof' requires frequent and expensive maintenance to survive. In practice, such a maintenance is unlikely to be provided for an insignificant structure of the garages. As a result, the 'green roof' is most likely to fail, exposing the flat roofing felt and making the new garages look s bad as the existing structures. 5. Perhaps a Condition of Maintenance Schedule for the 'green roof' should be imposed on the owners of the garages. Or a different roofing form, of permanent quality, should be proposed - eg. shallow sloping roof covered with slates, or similar. <p>Regards,</p> <p>Thomas Gliszczyński</p>
