## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed ground floor rear extension, by reason of its depth, scale and bulk would be incongruous and detrimental to the character and appearance of the host building and surrounding area contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP24 (Securing high quality



design) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

### **ENFORCEMENT ACTION TO BE TAKEN**

The Council has authorised the Planning Department to instruct the Borough Solicitor to issue an Enforcement Notice alleging breach of planning control.
