To Whom It May Concern at Camden Planning in regard to 21 Swain's Lane.

Thank you for your notification of the above application dated December 4 2015.

- The application is incomplete since few details of the steam extraction unit are given.
- The fan is also not fully specified nor located on the drawings.

Given the above this application cannot be properly assessed, and I agree with the submission made to you by Martin Narraway of Holly Lodge Estate CAAC, of which I am also a member, that the applicant should provide full details of the extraction system proposed before a decision is taken, and that these details should be circulated to all of us who have responded to this application for our comments.

I also want it specified in regard to the Louvre doors in the plans, that this door is kept shut at all times to help attenuate the noise of the compressor and fan of the air conditioning unit.

Although this is a separate issue to the above application I want to add that in November 2010 I objected to the Planning Application 210/5221/P, in regard to the extraction unit proposed for Kalendars in Swain's Lane. My objection was not granted, but I think that Camden Planning need to seriously consider if they made the right decision.

It is important that you know that those of us who are residents above these businesses in Swain's Lane have, for a long time now, serious issues in regard to the noise, vibrations, and fumes, emitted from the extraction units of these businesses. These matters seriously detract from our rightful enjoyment of our homes, particularly but not only, the enjoyment of our roof terraces during the Summer months.

One local resident has suggested that this new extraction unit, if agreed, needs to be continually 'policed', in regard to noise and fumes. I would go further, and say that it is necessary for all the extraction units in Swain's Lane referred to above, to be continually and regularly kept under observation in regard to fumes, noise, vibration, and any other issues that spoil our rightful enjoyment of our homes.
