The building itself is a mixed bag of structures of various ages. The church was originally built in the 20's, 1820's. and during the WW2 it was substantially damaged by bombs. It was rebuilt and repaired. Over the years, the maintenance cost of such a building has become prohibitively high. It comes to a point when the people who are using the building have to decide whether it is more economical in the long run to demolish and rebuild the whole building altogether. Also, as it is, the space within the church is no longer able to serve a 21st vibrant church. Every Sunday, we have up to 200 people attending our three services (Cantonese Service, Mandarin Service, International Service) and on top of that our Sunday School children. During the week, we have Chinese Migrants service, Gambling Reform service, and social service work which includes Chicken Chow Mein for Our Neighbours (CCM), Friday Club and Winter Shelter. I help out in CCM which is a Wednesday lunch time service for our low income/no income Kings Cross neighbours and homeless people. This service has been extremely popular with our guests. We serve up to 50 people during that hour and a half lunch time opening each Wednesday. We are in our fourth year of this service. We are not short of volunteers but our service has been very much limited by the size of our kitchen. So we are not able to fulfil the full potential of this social service. Our Chicken Chow Mein has recently been recognised as one of the Camden50 Exceptional Volunteers for supporting the Community.
