The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

The information submitted demonstrates that there will be no increase in the run off rate compared to the existing site. Given the site is currently hard paved and used as parking it generates a run off lower than generally accepted as a practical minimum rate for storm water flow control. Therefore, it is considered acceptable that the site will continue to discharge at the pre-development rate of 3.6l/s.



As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policy CS5 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policy of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies. The proposed development also accords with policies 5.12 and 5.13 of the London Plan March 2015, consolidated with alterations since 2011; and paragraphs 93-108 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

2 You are reminded that condition 11 (Green roof) of planning permission 2013/3794/P granted on 04/06/2014 are outstanding and require details to be submitted and approved.
