					Further to your letter giving notice of the above application, I write confirming my objection to the
					demolition of the existing Methodist Church and the redevelopment of the site, 2015/7013/P
					I have read the documents provided by the applicants and find them unreliable and failing on nearly every count to make the case for demolition and redevelopment.
					The reasons for my objections are as follows;
					1 The Methodist Church fails to address the local problem of homelessness as claimed and has ignored a lll points raised by members of the local community in developing this proposal.
					I am a long term resident of Cresfield Street and over the years have become aware of the work in the
					local community carried out by the Methodists and am therefor sympathetic to any real need to adapt this accommodation to their changing needs. My contact with the Church however suggests that the
					building remains underused and adequately supports their present level of work in the community. The
					existing building would also undoubtedly support any future attempt by the methodists to increase their scope and field of activity. However if redevelopment is deemed to be absolutely necessary to the
					church, it must not be at the cost of demolishing historic buildings or result in overdevelopment of the
					site. The proposal as submitted will radically alter the character of the Conservation Areas and fail to enhance these in any way.
					2 The development will dominate my property and lead to a reduction of daylight. The Council must
					check the Lighting report submitted by the applicant very closely.
					The bulk and increased height of the building immediately adjacent to the rear of 5 Crestfield Street will impact upon natural lighting available to my flat.
					3 The application attempts to gain consent for a high density of residential units on the back of assisting the church. The design ignores the existing character of both the adjoining Conservation
					Areas.
					The design is inappropriate in bulk, density, massing and detail. The design unnecessarily overstates the church in relation to the streetscape.
					The proposal ignores the historic building which is to be totally demolished. No case is made
					which warrants such demolition and no grounds are evident in the proposed wan scheme that

redevelopment enhances the Conservation areas in any way.

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The association of the Methodists with this site is a long one and that is embodied in the continued existence of the early C19th chapel built between 1823 and 1825. The facade of this important building is still discernible in the altered frontage to Birkenhead Street and any redevelopment should both retain this and enhance it. The same should also be said of the Chapalancy House frontage to Crestfield Street built circa 1952.

Clearly at the time of constructing the terraces which abut the site in the 1840"s, the retention of the existing Chapel in Birkenhead Street and the retention of the grave yard in Crestfield Street resulted in the new terraced housing never being intended or able to link over the two street elevations. The later abandonment of the grave yard, still shown as existing on the OS map of 1949/51, allowed the construction of the Chaplaincy House as an infill building in 1952/53. However this construction work did not seek to link the height of the terraces but was created in a completely different style of a deferential scale. The character of the street was positively determined by the encompassing of the Chapel and the inserting of the Chaplaincy House. The two idiosyncratic buildings breaking the neighbouring uniform terraces was then the desired character during the period of the original developments on the site and remained the street character at the time of establishing the Conservation Area. This should therefore continue to be the character embodied in any redevelopment. The present scheme fails to respect this important element of character.

My detailed argument against the proposals is a follows:

ELEVATION 1 Crestfield Street

- 1, Inappropriateness of the overt verticality which conflicts with the delicate balance of horizontal and vertical which establishes the character of the existing and adjoining Listed Buildings
- 2, Failure to reflect the bay width of the adjoining Listed Buildings, the repetition of which which is a strong force in the established character of the adjoining terraces
- 3, Additional storeys though set back dominate the adjoining listed buildings and undermine the character of the Conservation Area. The scheme represents gross overdevelopment of the site in relation to existing heights and established density.
- 4, If the argument is deemed acceptable in that the new building improves the setting of the Listed Buildings and the Conservation Area then the overall height should be set by the adjoining buildings and not existing piecemeal additions in height recognised as detrimental to the area by the applicants" submission. Please refer to the applicants Heritage statement in this respect.
- 5, Pushing the building line forward by the addition of the two towers is wholly inappropriate and further erodes the character of the listed buildings and the conservation area. This provision fails to observe the existing building line.
- 6, The selected materials do nothing to harmonise with the perceived character of the street. They have

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been selected in relation to buildings in Euston Road not Crestfield Street or Birkenhead Street and thereby extend the commercial character of this street into an area primarily of residential character.

7, There is inadequate justification for the two towers and their attendant oversized crosses. The scheme fails to recognise the historic built form and iconography of Methodist Chapels despite giving excellent references in the Heritage Statement. The inclusion of any tower let alone two is the ecclesiastical language of the protestant church and not the Methodist dissenters.
The elevation of the altered main front located in Birkenhead Street demonstrates very effectively what would be more appropriate. The proposed towered entrance is then inappropriate in scale, emphasis, iconography and general design.

- 8, Concerns exist that the plan creates nuisance areas. As a long term resident of Crestfield St, I am only too aware of the antisocial behaviour suffered in the street caused by sex workers, rough sleeping, drug dealing and using, loitering youth and urination, I add photographs (please find separately) showing incidence of such nuisance. The projecting towers stepped out of the building line of the rest of the street creating new zones for such nuisance to increase. The provision of railings are rooted in the character of the Conservation area and mentioned specifically in the listing notices issued for the adjoining Listed Buildings. Their introduction should be considered in order to prevent nuisance and enhance the character of the scheme.
- 9, I am concerned to ensure that there be no access to the terrace adjacent to top floor of 5 Crestfield Street. Such a provision would create nuisance to the flat I inhabit and thereby reduce my enjoyment of my property.

ELEVATION 2 Birkenhead Street

- 1, The existing though altered facade to the original Chapel is important both architecturally and historically. The Heritage Statement accompanying the application details on page 29 the alterations to this facade and in doing so draws out its well proportioned composition, shows the appropriateness of the architecture to the original designated use and how it could be restored or retained and altered to serve as an entrance to the proposed development. The existing building despite the alterations is far better than anything included in the proposals forming the application.
- The same drawing shows the appropriateness of the scale and overall height of the existing building in being subservient to the adjoining terraces. If the pediment were to be reformed the original trick of overcoming the disparity in heights between chapel and terraces would be a very positive improvement
- 2, Inappropriateness of the design which conflicts with the existing and adjoining Listed Buildings. The faced is frankly ugly, failing to be either a good pastiche or offer good and competent complementary modern design. The proportions and the basic need to accept window lines and storey heights is crass. Nothing has been done to ease ignoring the established rules of the terraces within this elevation.

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				3, Additional storeys though set back dominate the adjoining listed buildings, Again I refer you back to the street elevation of page 29 of the Heritage Statement.	
				4, I repeat if the argument is deemed acceptable in that the new building improves the setting of the Listed Buildings and the Conservation Area then the overall height should be set by the adjoining buildings and not existing piecemeal additions in height recognised as detrimental to the area by the applicants" submission. Please refer to the applicants Heritage statement in this respect where they argue that the additional storeys have destroyed the asset value of the Georgian building. 5, The selected materials do nothing to harmonise with the evident character of the street.
