Dear Sirs,

I am the tenant of ground floor flat number 1 at 99 Greencroft Gardens London NW6 3PG.

I fully support the proposal to remove the lime trees outside numbers 99 and 101 Greencroft Gardens.

Apart from the visible and unacceptable state of the front area wall and pathways, the degree of cracking in my flat is totally unacceptable to the extent that I have felt unable to entertain given the ugly and pervasive cracking in the walls and ceilings in the flat. Despite previous efforts to hide the cracks in previous year of my tenancy, cracks have both reappeared and increased in number and dimension.

This problem cannot be adequately compensated by money; the only solution being to remove the underlying cause permanently.

I do sincerely hope that the pernicious cause of such damage and distress will now be eradicated once and for all.

I notice that further up the road, on the other side, there is a notice indicating that a tree will have to be destroyed but will be replaced, presumably with a benign species. This would appear to be a sensible solution which could be repeated in this instance.
