Thank you David.

Please could you ask the developer to provide the information missing on page 84 of the Masterplan. There are lots of xxxm2 under the description of the development. It would be useful if they could extract the community centre - D1? - from the residential floorspace too.

Other things that have come up:

Transport

It looks as if the traffic survey was done on 21 July 2015. While this was technically the last day of term in Camden, St Mary & St Pancras and St Aloysius schools broke up on 17 July 2015. These schools are within the study area and certainly produce traffic on Ossulston Street, Chalton Street, Phoenix Road and Polygon Road. I haven't asked Edith Neville, Regent High or Maria Fidelis schools when they broke up - perhaps Children, Schools and Families as developer could provide the information. (I think most schools used the last two days of term for INSET.)

Anyway, it is certain that normal traffic flow and usage conditions did not apply on 21 July 2015 (the figures jumped out at local residents). The schools I have identified have a combined roll of 674 pupils.

Parking

Parking Capacity and Utilisation was taken from the parking survey undertaken on 21 July 2015. Please see above.

We were consulted last summer on changes to parking in the area. I've attached copies of the documents. The Crick are carrying out the works now, so I assume this application went ahead. There seems to be some confusion about the actual number of parking places currently on Brill Place (I think one parking assessment dates from January/February 2015). Also, the true figures on places and capacity across Somers Town. This is obviously key to the development so we need clarification.

Air quality

The traffic survey feeds into this document. (I haven't checked if it informs any other documents). Another possible revision to the air quality report would be the figures from the Phoenix Court DHP. It appears that emissions from the CHP and Boiler have been modelled on current energy requirements with 1 CHP and 2 boilers (plus 1 standby). The Sustainability and Energy Masterplan says that 4 x 1.3MW boilers are planned. Given the emission zone includes two nurseries and sheltered housing, the figures need to be right. One of the many reasons we need an Environmental Impact Assessment.

I am very concerned about your response to the emails sent to you by Ms Ramphal on behalf of many residents. She has politely and persistently requested that you give Somers Town residents some clarity about the deadlines.

I have myself received a complaint by a resident in Cooper Lane about a letter from you asking for a response by? Well, that is the question as two different dates were given, one by adding to the letter date and another date. Added to this were the 1st, 8th and 23rd given on the website.

This has created not only great confusion but also the distress of re-adjusting timetables, the struggle to understand what is going on and having to waste time on trying to sort this out.

We do not believe that you can change a date backwards. Now that it has been stated twice on the website, the date for the deadline has to be the 23rd.



Proposed Public Realm and Road Safety Improvements on Brill Place, Ossulston Street and Midland Road

We are seeking your views on the Council's proposals to improve road safety and public realm on the streets surrounding the newly built development known as The Francis Crick Institute (Europe's Centre for Biomedical Research) located at 1-2 Brill Place adjacent to the British Library. Planning permission for the £650 million institute was granted in March 2011 and at that time Camden Council worked closely with the developer to secure funding for various measures for the local community.

Funding has been secured to enhance the street environment and improve road safety in the vicinity of the new development. Council officers have met with the developer to discuss improvements that would help meet the needs of the development. In addition we are also keen to improve access to Kings Cross and St Pancras stations as well as improve safety for local residents.

The changes proposed are summarised below, and are shown in more detail on the plan overleaf.

- Provide five new general disabled bays: three will be located on Brill Place and two on Ossulston Street. These are to meet the conditions of the planning application granted for the development.
- 2. Introduction of a pick/up drop off point on Midland Road.
- 3. Creation of a new pedestrian access route between Ossulston Street and Midland Road with emergency vehicular access only (via crossovers) at both ends of the route.
- Construction of a new raised table (raised road from kerb to kerb) on Ossulston Street.
 This will provide a level crossing point for pedestrians and access to the newly built pedestrian access route.
- Planting of new trees which will enhance the public realm on Brill Place, Midland Road and Ossulston Street. Due to the lack of existing footway space some trees will be housed by building out small sections of the footway.
- 6. The provision of vehicular crossovers, footway build outs to house trees, general disabled parking spaces and the creation of a new raised table will result in the loss of 10 residents' parking spaces on Ossulston Street. In order to compensate for this loss, 7 residents' parking space will be relocated and added to the existing 6 residents' parking spaces in Brill Place. This will result in the overall loss of 3 residents' parking bays in the local area.
- 7. The provision of the raised table will mean respacing the remaining road humps on Ossulston Street. This will result in three road humps being removed and two relocated further along the same street.
- 8. Repave footway around the development on Midland Road, Brill Place and Ossulston Street. This will include resurfacing the road on Ossulston Street and Brill Place adjacent to the development.

The Council recognises that there will be a loss of residents' parking bays in Ossulston Street. In order to determine how this would impact on residents, the Council carried out a parking occupancy surveys in March 2015. This showed that the residents' parking bays are occupied at an average of 85% of the time. In comparison, some streets in the same area show that parking bays are occupied over 95% of the time. This demonstrates that there is some scope to reduce residents' parking spaces without having a significant impact on local residents.

If agreed, the proposed measure will be implemented before autumn this year and all measures will be paid from the funding secured from the developer.
