## Camley Bridge, Camley Street and Wharf Road Viaduct

Reserved matters for Camley Bridge, a new pedestrian and cycle bridge and ramp over the Regent's Canal and through the northern end of the Camley Street Natural Park, from King's Cross Central to Caml; ey Street, with associated landscaping including removal of existing trees and replanting of shrubs and trees as required by conditions 6, 9, 10, 16, 18, 19, 20, 21, 31, 45, 55, 56, 64-67 of outline planning permission reference 2004/2307/P dated 22/12/06 (subject to S106 agreement) for a comprehensive, phased, mixeduse development of former railway lands within the King's Cross Opportunity Area.
