Thank you for your letter/telephone call of 12 January 2015 giving notice that the above tree(s) are considered dead/dying /dangerous and require emergency works.

The Council confirms that the remedial works as described above are exempt from the need for further notifications or any formal application to the Council and you are therefore allowed to proceed.

Informative(s):

- 1 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 2 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is



the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For further information contact Natural England on 0300 060 4911 or [www.naturalengland.org.uk](http://www.naturalengland.org.uk).

- 3 Where the removal of tree(s) has taken place the owner has a duty under Section 206 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) to plant a replacement. In this case the Council requires that a Lime be planted as a Heavy Standard with a girth size of 12-14cms - unless a suitable alternative is agreed with the council in writing. The ground should be prepared to the standards set out in BS5236:1975. The tree should be suitably staked and tied. The replacement should be planted as soon as reasonably possible, and by no later than the end of the following planting season.
