1 Reasons for granting permission:

The applicant has provided correspondence with Transport for London which confirms that the development is unlikely to affect London Underground



Infrastructure. This has been confirmed by TfL Underground team as part of this application. Therefore no objection is raised to the approval of condition 17.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the conservation area, under s.72 of the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.
