Dear Sir of Plaudill,	

I write to formally object to the planning appeal by Paddy Power, seeking to convert the use class of 64 Kilburn High Road from A1 retail to sui generis betting shop.

Unquestionably Kilburn High Road is saturated with betting shops. Residents do not want any more, local Cllrs likewise do not wish any more.

The number of gambling licences in the High Rd is well into double figures.

Without doubt the addition of another gambling outlet will further reduce the diversity of the retail offer on a shopping street that serves most of North West London.

Betting shops, to a significant extent, attract a customer base, who remain in the premises all day. By their very nature then such outlets remove footfall from other retailers.

Also there is anti-social behaviour associated with these types of premises, which often reduces the attractiveness of the vicinity of the address.

All this is against Camden's planning policies, as outlined in the council's decision notice.

It is no overstatement to say the community myself and Council Colleagues represent feels under attack; attack from the constant onslaught of more and more gambling premises, which are strangling retail in our town centre.

I humbly urge that you reject the appeal, protect our residents, and stem the tide of gambling premises which are not wanted in our area.
