I strongly object to the above application. I have two young daughters and they use the parks on Polygon Road and Purchase Street regularly. The playground is really popular and they often go there after school. It will have a big impact on their childhoods if they cannot use the playground because it is a building site for years. Even when finished the proposed playground is smaller than the existing one. This is not acceptable as children from all the primary schools and nurseries in Somers Town use it.

I am also really concerned about air quality as someone who suffers with asthma. I live near Euston Road and the air quality is really bad. I am worried that all the building works will cause more pollution. The plans mean cutting down dozens, maybe 100 trees. That means the air quality is going to get worse and could increase the chances of my asthma becoming worse also. The works are likely to be going on at the same time as HS2 and Crossrail2, making Somers Town a nightmare to live in.

I also strongly object to building a 25-storey tower block on the park. The council should not be building on the parks. The tower block will be massive and will change Somers Town forever. The nine-storey block at the bottom of Charrington Street is also too big and will spoil the views through the area.
